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Remember!

If the report cannot be conducted due to your non-compliance, which may include your failure to attend the assessment meeting, not providing urine samples, or not interacting with the professionals, you may be deemed ineligible for our programs.



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Indicative Assessment Report

What is an Indicative Assessment?

If you are found to meet the criteria for eligibility and if the court is able to confirm your willingness to engage in and successfully complete a specified treatment program, the Court will issue an order to the National Drug Agency (NDA) requesting an indicative assessment to be conducted on you.

The process aims to gather relevant information and make an informed decision regarding your drug dependency and the most suitable treatment approach.

During the assessment, various factors may be taken into account to determine the severity of your drug dependency. These factors may include drug use history, patterns of drug consumption, any prior attempts at treatment, physical and mental health assessments, social and family background, and other relevant information. The assessment process typically involves the involvement of authorized professionals, such as substance abuse counselors or healthcare providers specializing in addiction treatment.

What should I do?

- ✓ Attend the assessment meetings at the designated times and places as decided by NDA.
- ✓ Maintain constant availability and be accessible for contact at all times.
- ✓ Provide clear and truthful responses to all inquiries from the professionals conducting the assessment.
- ✓ Be prepared for the possibility of being asked to provide a urine sample.
- ✓ NDA may request specific health or other types of reports from you. Ensure that you gather and submit the requested reports in a timely manner

Where will I be during this period?

During the assessment period, you may be granted release on bail or subject to other conditions as determined by the Court, or alternatively, you may be placed in a Drug Offender Remand Center.
